RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES

Entries must be submitted on the official entry form for this show. ALL HORSES SHOULD BE PRE-REGISTERED with entries being post-marked no later than July 01, 2009. STALL FEES ARE THE ONLY FEES THAT ABSOLUTELY MUST ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY FORM. All entries, changes and scratches must be made ONLY with the show secretary in the Cashvan Pavilion and must be made one hour before the beginning of each session.

ACCESS TO THE GROUNDS

All horses must enter the fairgrounds through the livestock entrance or back gate. Due to the fair crowds it is requested that all exhibitors arrive on the grounds prior to 5:00PM each day.

CAMPER SPACES

The Virginia Horse Center has 78 camping spots with 30/50 amp electric & water hookups. Camping is \$30 per night payable to the Virginia Horse Center. Reservations can be made online at www.horsecenter.org or at the Welcome Center/Stable Office. Selection of reserved sites is upon arrival. Camping without reservations will be permitted only if there are vacancies. Questions can be directed to stableoffice@horsecenter.org or 540.464.2966.

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

To be eligible to compete in a championship class, horses must be entered, shown and judged in a qualifying class in its division or section.

CHECKS

Exhibitors are invited (but not required) to attach a check to the entry form for full payment of all fees. HOWEVER, STALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN FULL BEFORE STALLS ARE ASSIGNED. The Rockbridge Country Fair Horse Show will enforce an OPEN CHECK POLICY. An OPEN CHECK must be left with the office in the exhibitor folder before any numbers will be released. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor or agent to settle his account within one hour after the end of the show. Failure to do so will give the Horse Show Secretary authority to fill in the correct amount owed to the Horse Show. All checks returned for non-payment will be charged a \$50.00 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified check or money order.

CLASSES

All classes are non-rated but will be run in accordance with USEF, ADS, or NHSC rules and regulations respectively. THE DECISION OF THE JUDGE IS FINAL.

COGGINS

State law mandates that each exhibitor must possess a negative Coggins Test executed within the past twelve (12) months for each horse entered. Please ensure that the name of the horse that appears on the Coggins Papers matches the horse's name on all entry blanks. A copy of the Coggins Test must be submitted with entries and will remain as a permanent part of the show file. A copy of the Coggins Papers will also be collected at the gate. To expedite entry to the show grounds, exhibitors are urged to have an extra coggins copy available for each horse to leave with Security Personnel at the gate.

DOG LEASH REQUIREMENTS

All dogs must be kept on a leash and under close supervision while on the fair grounds. No pets are allowed in the coliseum, any office, carnival area, midway or food court area. All pets are the owner's responsibility.

EXHIBITORS RESPONSIBILITIES

Exhibitors are required to give the necessary personal attention to and maintain control of their animals and equipment at all times. When animals are moved about, they shall be constantly attended. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss or damage done to, occasioned by, or arising from any animal or vehicle owned or exhibited by the exhibitor and shall indemnify the show and hold it harmless from any loss, cost or expense caused. The exhibitor assumes all risk of loss, injury, or damage of every kind and nature, however caused, to the property belonging to him and any of his employees. Exhibitors are urged to keep attendants at their exhibit at all times and to carry insurance for their protection against any losses that might be incurred and to protect themselves from risks assumed under this clause.

GOLF CARTS

Virginia Horse Center has golf carts available for rental. Reservations for the carts will be handled directly with the Stable Office at the Virginia Horse Center by emailing stableoffice@horsecenter.org or by phone 540.464.2966.

GROUNDS FEES

There will be no fees charged for showing off your trailer, but you must display a fair parking pass to gain access to the fair grounds, using the back entrance.

IN-GATE CLOSING

There will be a two (2) minute gate call commencing after the first horse enters the ring unless a hold has been announced. All requests for holds shall be submitted in writing to the announcer and shall contain the class number, exhibitor back numbers, and reason for the hold. Requests must be submitted at least 5 classes in advance. Judging will not start until the gate is officially closed.

MEDICAL WASTE

The Virginia Horse Center provides Red BioHazard Containers located at the wash racks in each barn for the disposal of all used needles, syringes and other supplies. Medical waste must not be discarded in stalls, manure pits, garbage cans or on the grounds. Violators will be prosecuted.

OFFICE FEES

Each horse will be assessed a one-time office fee of \$3.00

OFFICE LOCATION

The Horse Show Office will be located upstairs in the Cashvan Building (between the outdoor ring- Wiley Arena and the covered ring (Moore Arena).

PARKING

Due to fair activities, trucks and trailers will be allowed to park only in designated areas. IF all parking lots are filled to capacity, exhibitors MAY be required to park their trucks in alternate parking areas. Vehicles must be REMOVED from the barn area IMMEDIATELY after unloading. All aisles and roadways around the barns must be kept open due to fire regulations. No vehicles are allowed in the barns at any time. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT ALL VEHICLES PROCEED DIRECTLY TO THE PARKING AREAS, WITH NO VEHICLES BEING DRIVEN THRU THE FAIR MIDWAY. HORSE SHOW TRAFFIC MUST STAY IN THE DESIGNATED AREAS. Failure to comply may result in all horse show folks having to park on top of the hill in the future.

PARKING PASSES

Parking passes will be mailed to the agent designated on the entry form, who in turn is responsible for distributing the passes to his/her clients. Each owner will receive 1 parking pass. Entries received after July 5, 2009 will not receive parking passes in the mail - parking passes may be picked up in the horse show office upon arrival.

PRIZE MONEY

All prize money will be paid by check within thirty (3) days after the show closes. All accounts must be paid in full before checks can be issued.

REFUNDS

Refunds requested in writing before July 5, 2009 will be honored, less a \$20.00 administration fee. No refunds after this date unless the request is accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate of illness or lameness on an official letterhead. Another horse may be substituted.

SCHOOLING

Schooling will not be allowed between barns, on the midway, or in carnival or food court areas. Fletcher Arena will be open at all times for schooling purposes.

RESPONSIBILITIES: HORSE SHOW

The Rockbridge County Fair Horse Show and its Management will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it will be a condition of the entry that each exhibitor or owner shall hold the Horse Show and its Management harmless for any loss or accident to his or her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. The Horse Show and its Management will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed or stolen, and will not be responsible or liable for injury sustained in any way by exhibitors, spectators, employees or other involved parties. HORSE SHOW MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO:

- (1) Vary or add to the names of those officials who have been invited to participate.
- (2) Add, combine or cancel any class.
- (3) Refuse any or all entries, return any money paid for stalls or entry fees without explanation or recourse to the Show for liability or compensation. The Show shall be under absolute control of the Management. Only qualified persons shall be allowed in the ring during judging. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judge or officials by the owner, rider, trainer, or groom will disqualify horse or rider, and the owner shall forfeit all fees and payments.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Smoking inside barns is prohibited. Bicycles may not be ridden in the barns, coliseum or any part of the upper facility. Failure to comply will result in the impounding of the bicycle until the close of the show. No vehicles are allowed in the interior of the barns at anytime. Golf carts, powered scooters and mopeds will be permitted on fair grounds and must be registered with the fair office prior to use on the fair grounds. Fair rules will apply for their use. These vehicles can only be operated by a person who holds a valid unrestricted motor vehicle driver's license. Motorcycles, four-wheelers, non powered scooters, skateboards and inline skates are not permitted on the premises. Gas, electric or propane heaters, propane tanks and hot plates are prohibited in stall areas, unless approved by the fair management. All electrical extension cords must be twelve (12) gauge, three (3) wire and prong negative ground type.

STALLS

Due to a limited number of stalls, ALL STALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN FULL IN ADVANCE before stalls can be assigned. The fee for a horse stall or tack stall is \$40.00. The Show will provide 1 free tack stall per agent that registers 5 or more horses. Stalls are to be used by one horse only and will be bedded with shavings only. Shavings are available for purchase and must be paid for (or leave and open check) when picked up at the designated stable office. Exhibitors are encouraged to pre-order bedding on their entry blank. Hay will be available for purchase at the stable office.

To be judged on manners, performance, quality & conformation.

All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge, and may be asked to execute a figure eight and/or perform other appropriate tests. Judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness & vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire & overall impression and 30% on performance, manners & way of going.

WORKING CLASSES

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge & may be asked to execute a figure eight. Judged 70% on performance, manners & way of going, 20% on the condition & fit of harness & vehicle, and 10% on neatness of attire.

REINSMANSHIP CLASSES

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability & skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge & may be asked to execute a figure eight and/or perform other appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" with the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. In order to evaluate a driver's versatility, the judge may request a test involving driving with one hand. To be judged 75% on handling of reins & whip, control, posture, & overall appearance of driver and 25% on the condition of harness & vehicle and neatness of attire.

PICK YOUR ROUTE

To be driven over a course of cones with no set route. The number of cones will not exceed 20. The cones will be set at a standard 2.5 meters or 8'3": at the start of the competition, and will only be reset in the event of a knockdown. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his own route. Each obstacle is to be negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time (see ADS Rule Book for penalty assessments). Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.

The course will be the same for single pony, single horse and multiples. A driver may not compete more than once in the same obstacle class or in classes which use the same course. Course maps will be available in the horse show office when exhibitors check in. Show attire is required.

Drivers will be allowed time to walk the course prior to the start of a class and to inspect each obstacle. While walking the course, drivers shall not alter, adjust or in any way move an obstacle, or any part thereof. Should a competitor have any questions regarding a specific obstacle, he should call it to the attention of the technical delegate for clarification and/or adjustment.

Drivers are prohibited from driving, leading or riding horses or from permitting the horses to be driven, led, or ridden on any course at any time prior to the competition. Failure to comply incurs elimination.

A person who rides as a groom/passenger with one entry may not compete as a driver in the same class, or in any class using the same course. Grooms may not stand behind the driver. If the vehicle does not permit the groom to sit behind the driver, permission must be obtained to allow the groom to sit beside the driver.

Course will be announced prior to the start of the Pleasure Driving Show on Saturday morning.
